Biography: Dr. Peck has been a licensed clinical psychologist for more than 25 years. He holds MS and PhD degrees from Tufts University. He completed his clinical internship at Children's Hospital and postdoctoral fellowships at McLean Hospital and the Departments of Psychiatry & Neurology at Harvard Medical School, Peter Bent Brigham and Children's Hospitals. He was awarded the Diplomate in Clinical Neuropsychology (ABPP-ABCN) in 1985. With Jerry Sweet, he was the co-director of the 2002 NAN/Div 40 National Survey Of Clinical Neuropsychology In The United States. He is a Fellow of the National Academy Of Neuropsychology and holds two Presidential Commendations from that organization. He recently completed a two year appointment as the Director of the NAN Professional Advocacy and Information Committee. He divides his practice among clinical and forensic related services in neuropsychology and he consults nationally on the business aspects of private practice. He is the author/coauthor of numerous articles, book chapters and presentations in the field of clinical neuropsychology.

#### Objectives:

1. Participants will obtain current information about how the CPT codes for Psychological and Neuropsychological Assessment are being interpreted across the country by CMS Medicare Regions and the National Correct Coding Initiative *at the present time* – and how this can affect the professional practice of neuropsychology.

3. Participants will improve their knowledge base regarding the business aspects of their professional practice.
